

Details of Cape Pilgrimage to new Museum of African American History and Culture at the Smithsonian in Washington DC, on October 25th:

Dear Friends, Thank you for your patience! I am writing with details for making reservations for our Cape Pilgrimage to the new Museum of African American History and Culture at the Smithsonian in Washington D.C on Friday, October 25, returning on Sunday, October 27th. We will be traveling on a Cape Destinations deluxe bus and staying at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Arlington, Virginia just over the bridge and close to the museum. We will have 55 tickets. We have been able to secure very good prices: \$ 85.00 per person for the bus and \$ 165.00 per person for two nights at the hotel. The tickets are free. The hotel rooms are 2 person to a room. The total cost is \$250.00 per person for r/t bus and hotel accommodations. If you are married or have a friend you want to room with please note that when you send me a deposit. If you are NOT going to travel on the bus and/or you are NOT going to stay at the hotel there will be a charge of \$10.00 for NOT going on the bus and \$15.00 for NOT staying at the hotel. This is because we have to pay for the empty seats and empty beds.

Please let me know by email whether you will be participating in the pilgrimage. Please mail me a deposit of \$75.00 (or more if you wish) to reserve your tickets, room and seat. Checks should be made out to " Nauset Interfaith Association" with memo: pilgrimage. Those not going on the bus and/or staying at the hotel need to send me \$25.00, \$ 15.00 or \$10.00 as outlined above. Mail to Fr. Ken Campbell, Box 306, South Orleans, Ma. 02662. Reservations will be on a first come, first serve basis and we will probably have a short waiting list in case of cancellations. Please tell others about this pilgrimage.

This pilgrimage is sponsored by the Martin Luther King Action Team of the Nauset Interfaith Association and is open to all who wish to participate. The pilgrimage is motivated by a desire to take a positive individual and communal action fostering understanding, justice and reconciliation moving us toward the healing of our country and ourselves. We as a culture have never come to terms with the enslavement of one people and the genocide of another people during the founding and development of our country. It is our intention to provide a time to gather together for sharing and listening after we participate in this journey together.
