### **MEMBERSHIP UPDATE PAGE TO BE**

**DISCONTINUED:** This is the last time that the Membership Update Page will be posted. It began several years ago as a way to provide more in depth parish news than is often possible in the bulletin. However, most of what now appears is simply a repeat of bulletin material, and the number of people actually coming to this page has decreased significantly. Beginning next week the link on the Member Menu will bring you to the Weekly Bulletin.

UPDATED COVID PROTOCOLS: Masks will be optional for those fully vaccinated and boosted; masks are strongly recommended for those not fully vaccinated. (Masks are still necessary if you are visiting the office area of St. Peter's.)

Seating will no longer be restricted; however, we ask that you be sensitive to those who obviously wish to sit at a distance or wear a mask. Some people may choose to wear a mask during part of or all of the liturgy. On March 12 we will return to distributing communion hosts without the small plastic bags.

CHARITABLE GIFT FUND 2022: Thanks to everyone who submitted a proposal - we received a total of six proposals. The 2022 Charitable Gift Fund Committee will meet sometime during March to review the proposals and they will make their recommendations. Those recommendations will be voted upon by the parish at its May or June meeting.
